Our Parish

- The origins of St. Joseph's Church can be traced to a mission station in Hope about the year 1902.
- In 1915, permission was given to offer mass in the village of North Scituate.
- The old church was dedicated on March 19, 1939 and St. Joseph's was formally incorporated as a parish on January 9, 1940.
- The new church was finished in 1973.
- St. Joseph's is celebrating its 80th anniversary this year, 2019.

Throughout the years, the Diocese has considered St. Joseph's a very solid and vibrant community of faith in which to welcome others into the life of the Church in the Country.

Our Parish Projects

Replace the Church Roof

The current roof is over 20 years old and a portion of it is flat. Last winter the roof started to leak in several areas. It needs to be replaced before the interior of the church gets damaged.

Replace the Rectory Telephone System

The phone system is 22 years old and does not work properly.

Install a Security System for the Rectory

The security system would connect to the phone system and make the entryways of the rectory safer.

Upgrade the Church's Public Address System

The current P.A. System in the church fades in and out. It needs to be replaced to ensure everyone can hear the Liturgy.
